ADOPT-A-PARK

The Adopt-A-Park Program is designed to promote community involvement while maintaining and beautifying neighborhood parks and recreation facilities. The program is designed to be a low-key, relaxed and informal approach to involve people in the community to keep an eye out of potential hazards, vandalism and general park mistreatment. Through these partnerships the Town is able to maintain and improve the park system as well as keep our parks beautiful and safe for the enjoyment of our park users. The idea is for residents of a neighborhood to take ownership of their local park and improve the quality of the park through synergistic collaboration and creative activities as well as increased manpower. The adopted park is encouraged to be used as a focal point of neighborhood activities.

- Identify a park or trail you would like to adopt and type of project/activity you
 would like to do.
- Request an application from the Lillington Parks & Recreation Department.
 Complete the application and return to 607 S. 13th Street or bharris@lillingtonnc.org. You will then be contacted to discuss the adoption procedure. Parks & Recreation staff will work with the volunteer group to identify park needs.
- Once the "Adoption" is approved, the Adopt-A-Park Agreement is signed, and the requesting group can begin.
- Coordinate your project (s) with the Parks & Recreation Department. Necessary tools, materials and supplies may be provided to help the adopting group with their projects. Scope of project will depend heavily on the fiscal year budget for Parks & Recreation Department.
- All volunteers must sign a waiver release and service agreement prior to participation in the program.
- Recruit and schedule volunteers from your organization to implement the program.

Submit a quarterly activity report or pictures to update your progress.

WHO CAN ADOPT-A-PARK?

Any civic-minded individual, group or organization can adopt a Lillington park. Corporations, Garden clubs, social clubs, Scout groups, student organizations, youth sport teams, homeowner associations are just a few examples. Participants must be at least 12 years old to participate.

Adult Kickball

Kickback and enjoy this time socializing with friends and teammates while competing in one of America's favorite childhood games, kickball! Whether you're new to the game or have been kicking the ball around for years you will have lots of fun in our adult kickball league. Team and individual registrations are available. Teams play a minimum 8-game regular season followed by an end-of-season single-elimination tournament. Games will be held weekly. Teams must have a minimum of 12 players and can carry a maximum of 25 players. Team rosters must consist of at least 5 females and teams will alternate boy/girl through the lineup. Open to ages 16 and up. Season set to begin June 20, 2025 and run through July 19, 2025.

Flag Football

Registration Opens: June 27, 2025 **Cost:** Resident-\$25, Non-Resident-\$40 **Registration Closes:** July 18, 2025 at 4 p.m. or until full

LPR flag football is a coed league for ages 5–8, as of November 1, 2025. This program is designed to introduce football in a fun and safe environment. Coaches will focus on teaching some basic fundamentals and improving existing skills with minimal contact. Flag football typically practices and plays games during the week and on Saturdays. All practices and home games are typically held at Bradley Field. LPR provides game shirt and flag belts. Parents are responsible for black shorts, rubber cleats and mouth guard (recommended).

Tackle Football

Registration Opens: June 27, 2025 **Cost:** Resident-\$25, Non-Resident-\$40 **Registration Closes:** July 18, 2025 at 4 p.m. or until full

LPR tackle football is for children ages 8-13, as of November 1, 2025. The tackle football program is an 11v11 recreational league which focuses on skill development, sportsmanship, fun and safety. Rules, age cut off dates and league divisions are all in alignment with the Harnett County Football League. Teams will typically practice and play games during the week and/or on Saturdays. All home games will be held at Bradley Field. LPR provides game jersey, helmet and shoulder pads. Parents are responsible for black game pants, mouth guards and rubber cleats.













Cheerleading

Registration Opens: June 27, 2025 **Cost:** Resident-\$25, Non-Resident-\$40

Registration Closes: July 18, 2025 at 4 p.m. or until full

Cheerleaders travel with teams and cheer at all home and some away football games per division. There are weekly practices and Saturday games. Cheer Squad will be instructed on chants, cheers, jumps and beginner small stunts. Parents must provide shoes, black shorts and bows. More instructions on uniform and equipment will be provided at the kick-off practice/parent meeting on a date to be determined. Practices will be held at Star Academy Gym and home games will pe held at Bradley Field.



NEW Football & Cheerleading Preseason Fundamentals

New this year, we will be offering football and cheerleading preseason fundamental clinics 2–3 times a week for registered athletes. Fundamental clinics will begin on July 21st.  Seniors get together monthly to create different crafts. The craft class is led by Mrs. Peggy Barnes and is fun for people of all crafting skill levels.







I live in Lillington but am being charged the non-resident rate. What is considered a Town of Lillington resident?

A resident is an individual who lives within the town limits of Lillington. A non-resident is an individual who lives outside of the town limits of Lillington. Simply having a "Lillington" address does not make one a resident; the corporate town limits is what dictates whether or not an individual is a resident. In order to receive the resident rate, an individual must live or own property inside the Town of Lillington town limits (meaning he or she pays Town of Lillington property taxes) and must show picture ID along with one of the following: Town of Lillington Utility Bill, apartment/ housing lease or a mortgage statement.

How do I create an account through your RecDesk portal to register for programs?

When registering for an event online for the first time, you will go to www.lillingtonpr.recdesk.com and select create account. Once you enter all of your information and submit it, you will see a page that states "Account is pending approval. You will receive an email when that step is complete." Someone from our staff will review your account within one business day and will approve your account as being either a resident or a non-resident. Once your account has been approved, you will receive an email stating your account has been approved and that you may now register for programs and activities. Once you receive the approval email from RecDesk, you will be able to login to your online account and register for the program(s) you wish to register for by selecting the "program registration" tab at the top of the page. Please know, that each member that you wish to register for a program must be approved through this same process.







I am trying to create an account through your RecDesk portal but it is telling me that my email address and/or phone number is already on file. What do I do?

If you receive an error message stating that your email address and/or phone number is already on file with us, that simply means that you (or someone that you share an email address or phone number with) have registered in person for something with us and we already have your account information on file. In order to help eliminate duplicate accounts, you will be unable to create a new account. All you need to do is contact the Parks and Recreation office and one of our staff members will be happy to provide you with the information you will need to get your online account set up.

Help, my child is 10 and I am trying to register him/her for a 10U sport but it says he/she does not meet the age requirements, why can't I get him/her registered?

All of our sports have age cut off dates. For example, the age cut-off date for our fall sports is November 1st of the current year (this year the age cut off is November 1, 2025; next year it will be November 1, 2026; etc.). So if you are trying to register your 10 year old child for 10U football because he/she is 10 right now, but he/she has a birthdate of October 31st (or any date before November 1st), he/she will need to be registered for 13U football because he/she will be 11 before the November 1st age cut-off date.
